PURPOSE OF THE CAB:

The Community Advisory Board (CAB) was tasked with ensuring Community Project Funding projects submitted to the Office of Congressman Pappas qualified under the guidelines laid out by the House Appropriations Committee, demonstrated a clear need, and made a positive impact on the community they serve.

Additionally, the CAB ensured submissions received a fair and equal opportunity to present their projects for their consideration.

REVIEW PROCESS:

All submissions for all Community Project Funding Requests that the Office received are posted below

The CAB reviewed projects and held meetings to review project requests. The municipalities and non-profits that submitted projects for consideration were invited to speak about their project, identify priorities, and answer questions.

Records of this meeting will be available to the public upon request.

All projects reviewed were asked to submit the following items for initial review:

- Project Cost
- Project Timeline
- Project Description
- Alternative or Additional Funding Sources

As part of the virtual project review meeting, each entity was asked to demonstrate a clear need and positive impact on the community. All entities that submitted multiple requests were asked to prioritize their submissions for the CAB

First District constituents also had an opportunity to submit comments for consideration and review by the CAB.

As part of the reforms associated with Community Project Funding, the House Appropriations Committee is requiring Members to submit a certification that neither they nor their immediate families have any financial interest in projects they request. BACKGROUND ON COMMUNITY PROJECT FUNDING:

Community Project Funding allows local governments and qualified non-profits to receive a one-time, small to medium-sized allocation to complete projects of local importance and priority. All funds will be limited to state and local governments and nonprofits that carry out quasi-government functions. For-profit institutions, such as private companies, will not be eligible for funding. As your Member of Congress, Representative Pappas is committed to advocating for these and other federal appropriations of importance to the First District. Community Project Funds will not increase overall spending levels. The funds are also limited to smaller amounts, targeted to local communities and select nonprofits.

The use of Community Project Funding has bipartisan support in Congress, with both House Democrats and Republicans supporting a transparent process as a way to target funds to projects that make sense for the district. New Hampshire has a long history of using these funds. Over fiscal years 2008, 2009, and 2010, both Republican and Democratic members of New Hampshire's Congressional delegation made community project funding requests which resulted in more than \$491,000,000 in federal funding to benefit New Hampshire communities.
